

## RAINBOW WIND CHIMES

WIND CHIMES

Natural elements spark all kinds of curiosity, and when kids create something from what they find outside, it holds a special kind of magic. These wind chimes will exercise their curiosity, their senses, and their motor skills, too!

## **MATERIALS**



Sticks

**Craft Varnish** 





**Sanding Block** 

**Small Screw Eyes** 





Paint

Twine, Fishing Line, or Yarn

## INSTRUCTIONS

- Start by going for a walk together and collecting sticks of different sizes.
- 2 Have your kids use the sanding block to scrub the sticks and smooth them out, preparing them for paint.
  - Your kids will love how different sanding makes the sticks feel. You can have them compare textures using words like rough and smooth, sharp and soft.
- 1 Let your kids choose which colors to paint the sticks, then paint them together and let them dry.
- Give the painted sticks a coat or two of craft varnish. This is optional, but important if you want to protect the paint from the elements.
- When the varnish is dry, attach the screw eyes into one end of each stick by pushing down and twisting.
- Tie a long length of twine to each hook and head back outside.
- Help your kids choose a branch to hang their wind chime on, and ask them what order they would like the colors to go in.
- 3 Hang the sticks, listen to their sounds as they knock together in the breeze, challenge your kids to jump and bat at them to create a new sound, and enjoy your one-of-a-kind yard art!
